Wild and Lone the Prophet's Voice

Text: Carl P. Daw, Jr., 1985

This text was written for a Hymn Society competition for Advent Hymns in 1985. This hymn was submitted to the competition with David Ashley White's tune.

Stanza 1. All four gospels identify John the Baptist with the prophecy of Isaiah 40:3 (see Matthew 3:1–12, Mark 1:2–8, Luke 3:1–20; John 1:19–28). The preaching attributed to him in stanzas 1 and 2 is based primarily on the account in Matthew.

Stanza 2. There are intentional echoes here of Galatians 5:22–23 and Colossians 3:1–2.

Stanza 3. The final stanza attempts to blend the acclamation of John the Baptist (John 1:29, 26) with the frequent images of the triumphant Lamb in the Book of Revelation (5:6–14).
