## The People Who in Darkness Walked

I have long loved the sprightly tune BEREDAN VÄG FÖR HERRAN, as well as the Messianic prophecy in Isaiah 9, which is familiar to musicians mainly through Handel's *Messiah*. I think this paraphrase began when I noticed that the first two phrases of what would become the refrain fit into an 87 87 hymnic meter, which happens also to be the hymnic meter for BEREDAN VÄG FÖR HERRAN. I wasn't familiar with any versifications of this section of Isaiah (which is not to say there weren't any) and thought it was such a significant passage that congregations deserved to sing it too! The rhymes are rather looser than I usually prefer but seemed to fit in this particular instance.
