"The prayer of St. Benedict of Nursia, founder of Western monasticism, touched me and made itself into a hymn text. Since he used the phrase 'Holy Father,' I did also, but when the editors of *The New Century Hymnal* asked to change it to 'God of Mercy,' I was quite agreeable. Benedict prayed:

Gracious and Holy Father, please give me:

intellect to understand you, reason to discern you, diligence to seek you,

wisdom to find you, a spirit to know you, a heart to meditate upon you, ears to hear you, eyes to see you, a tongue to proclaim you, a way of life pleasing to you,

patience to wait for you, and perseverance to look for you.

Grant me a perfect end, your holy presence, a blessed resurrection, and life everlasting." –Rae E. Whitney

Grant us faithfulness in praying, strength to keep our souls from straying, sense to cease from disobeying; Holy Father, hear us.


Grant us diligence in doing, patience when your truth pursuing, eager to receive renewing; Holy Father, hear us.
