# Canticle 9, First Song of Isaiah Surely It Is God Who Saves Me

**Text**: First Song of Isaiah, Isaiah 12:2–6, para. Herbert O'Driscoll, 1981.

"More a metrical psalm than a hymn, these lines were an attempt to make at least one of the sublime utterances of Isaiah (12:2-6) more accessible to a congregation. Relatively few metrical psalms have succeeded in becoming great hymns—a couple of exceptions that occur to mind are 'O God, our help in ages past" and 'The Lord's my shepherd, I'll not want.' As with most metrical psalms, one has a sense of lessening the power of the original lyrical prose. If that be the case here, then 'mea culpa.'" –Herbert O'Driscoll
